Proposed Revisions to Title 5, California Code of Regulations relating to Burden-Free Access to Instructional Materials

ADDING NEW SECTION 54221 TO SUBCHAPTER 4 OF CHAPTER 5 OF DIVISION 6 OF TITLE 5 OF THE CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS.

§ 54221. Burden-Free Access to Instructional Materials.

- (a) Governing boards shall adopt policies that ensure student burden-free access to instructional materials prior to the first day of a course, to the maximum extent feasible using available resources. District policies should maintain an instructor's responsibility to choose instructional materials, support student-centered practices that encourage the use of zero-cost instructional materials, and leverage available resources, including, but not limited to, the following:
- (1) developing and implementing sustainable zero-textbook-cost degrees, consistent with Education Code Section 78052;
- (2) adopting open educational resources or utilizing existing open educational resources;
- (3) establishing lending programs and maintaining college library resources to support immediate access to course materials;
- (4) developing policies that enables financial aid early disbursements consistent with 34 CFR 668.164(i);
- (5) encouraging and supporting students to complete their financial aid files early to receive timely disbursement; and
- (6) deploying other forms of direct aid and support program resources to strengthen student financial stability.
- (b) For the purposes of this section the following definitions apply:
- (1) "Instructional materials" means all of the required materials for a course including textbooks, educational software, and supplemental materials and supplies. Instructional materials do not include materials used or designed primarily for administrative purposes, class management, course management or supervision.
- (2) "Burden-free access" means obtaining instructional materials imposes no avoidable financial, administrative, or psychological burdens upon students related to acquisition of the instructional materials prior to the first day of a course.
